# STACY ROAD UPDATE



The Stacy Road project is moving into the pavement preparation phase. The concrete paving of the northern two lanes will begin in December. This phase will involve a number of intersections that must be poured in phases beginning in early 2017. TxDOT hopes to move traffic over onto the newly completed lanes by April 1, 2017. Once that occurs, they can start the process over again on the Allen side of the street, once again beginning with the underground storm sewer and retaining walls. Two-way traffic will occur on the northern two lanes during the summer and fall of 2017. The outside lane will be wider as TxDOT will widened the outside lane to accommodate cyclists. A sidewalk will go the full distance of the road as well. The sidewalk will be 10 feet wide except where there are restrictions like walls or creek crossings, where there are such restrictions it will be 6 feet wide. Please observe the recommended speed limit signs posted in the construction zones and drive safely.

# Christmas Tree Fire Safety

Christmas is around the corner and you don't want a simple mistake to set your Christmas tree and home ablaze. Here are a few fire safety tips for both live and artificial Christmas trees from your Fairview Fire Rescue:

- Always make sure Christmas lights are in safe, working condition. Keep an eye out for exposed or worn-out wires.
- Do not connect more than three strands of lights together.
- Keep your tree away from exposed flames and heat sources.
- Check manufacturers' labels for suggested lights and decorations that are flame retardant.
- Always turn off the lights on your tree when it is not supervised.
- Watch children and pets to avoid the chewing of wires and to prevent it from toppling over.
- Make sure artificial trees are flame retardant.
- Choose a live tree that looks fresh with green needles that do not fall off.
- Make sure your live tree stays hydrated and keep plenty of water in the base at all times.
- If a live tree develops brown and/or dropping needles, it is drying out and needs to be replaced.

# Fairview Alarm Permit Renewals

The Town of Fairview requires all alarm systems in any home or business in Fairview, whether monitored or not, to have a valid Alarm Permit. Alarm Permits must be renewed annually during the month of January.

The residential renewal fee is \$25 and the commercial renewal fee is \$50. The fee for a new residential permit is \$50 and a new commercial permit is \$100. If you have an alarm system and do not currently have an Alarm Permit, please contact Officer Gandy at SGandy@FairviewTexas.org or 972-886-4211, ext. 5022.

For those who currently have an alarm permit, online renewal begins January 1. Alarm permits must be renewed by January 31. To renew your permit, simply visit FairviewTexasAlarm.com. On the site, you will need to enter your login name and password. If you are having trouble remembering your login name and/or password, please contact Officer Gandy, do not create a new account if you are having issues accessing your old account. Thank you for your assistance.



## FIRE SPRINKLER MAINTENANCE

It is critical that a fire sprinkler system be regularly maintained, including ensuring that piping is fully and properly insulated. Sometimes insulation settles or is disturbed by someone moving or doing work in the attic. In some rare cases, an installer may have installed inadequate insulation, as the Town found in one home with broken piping several years ago.

In order to help prevent broken water pipes and the damage they can create, it is important that fire sprinkler systems be regularly inspected. A good rule of thumb is to walk your attic at least once per year. If you see any orange pipe, then the pipe is not properly insulated, possibly leading to a break during extreme weather. If you are unsure of what to look for in an inspection, ask the installer of your sprinklers to inspect the system for you. If your house contains an anti-freeze system, insulation is slightly less important, but additionally the anti-freeze solution should be tested annually by a professional installer to ensure there are proper amounts of anti-freeze in the fire-sprinkler system.

All fire sprinkler systems have shut-off valves. It is important to know where your shut-off valve is located. This valve allows you to turn off the flow of water to your sprinkler system in case of a malfunction. Please locate your valve now, make sure it is readily accessible. If it is locked, be certain you can locate the key during an emergency. And, remember to make sure more than one person in your home knows the location and how to operate the shut-off valve. You never know who will be at home during an emergency.

# Fairview Earns Platinum Scenic City Recertification



Fairview was presented with a platinum level Scenic City Certification on Thursday, October 6 at the Hilton Austin, in conjunction with the Texas Municipal League's Annual Conference taking place in Austin. City officials and business leaders were on hand to recognize Fairview, which was among 23 cities that earned certification or recertification, for the 2015-2020 period.

The Scenic City Certification Program is a project of Scenic Texas and its program partners, and is the first in the U.S. to incorporate a comprehensive set of model standards for design and development of public roadways and public spaces into one program. The program draws a direct correlation between the success of a city's economic development efforts and the visual appearance of its public spaces and recognizes municipalities that implement high-quality scenic standards.

Fairview is newly recertified as Platinum this year, having first earned this Platinum certification in 2011. Fairview earned nearly full certification points in every evaluation category. The Scenic City Certification Program took particular note of historical sites that are maintained throughout the town, with focus on the railroad route that once ran through Fairview. Impressively, all town construction projects must include public art.

Earning certification is straightforward: a city must initially meet three criteria before applying to the program including having a strictly regulated and enforced sign code, a ban on new billboards and a landscaping and tree-planting program. Then, a city's existing standards are assessed and scored based on a model of 70+ possible criteria ranging from percentage of park and open space, strong litter enforcement laws, street lighting standards, to parking lot landscaping, utility line management, and more. Under the scoring system, an applicant earns Recognized, Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum Certification.

"Scenic City Certification signifies Fairview's strong commitment to high-quality standards for public roadways and public spaces," said Anne Culver, executive director of The Scenic City Certification Program. "This recognition goes a long way in boosting Fairview's image, which in turn spurs economic development."

Scenic City Certification program partners include the American Planning Association Texas Chapter, American Council of Engineering Companies of Houston, Houston-Galveston Area Council, Keep Texas Beautiful, North Central Texas Council of Governments, Scenic America, Scenic Houston, Texas Downtown Association, Texas Economic Development Council, Texas Historical Commission, Texas Municipal League, Urban Land Institute – Austin, Urban Land Institute – Houston, and Urban Land Institute – San Antonio. 

# Town Quarterly Financial Report For Quarter Ending September 30, 2016

Monthly financial reports are prepared for the General Fund, Water and Wastewater Fund, Solid Waste Fund, Debt Service Fund, Stormwater Fund and Fairview EDC/CDC Funds, these reports are presented to the Town Council at their monthly meetings. These monthly financials can be accessed on fairviewtexas.org by selecting Departments/Administration/Audit-Budget.

This report covers through September 30, 2016, which is the end of the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2015-16; therefore, it is generally desirable for year-to-date revenue totals to have achieved 100 percent of the budgeted amount and for expenditures generally not to have exceeded 100 percent of their budgeted amounts.

## General Fund Analysis



Revenue collections in the General Fund for the twelfth month of fiscal year 2016 total \$7,781,952 and represent 99.2 percent of the total annual budget. Actual total collection this year is \$405,788 higher than last year.

The top revenue category that is higher than last year is Property Taxes with a total of \$3,331,595, which is \$348,583 higher than last year due to the 8 percent increase in assessed valuations and several agriculture parcels being “rolled back” for collection of additional \$52,817 in delinquent taxes & penalties.


Charges for Services increased \$80,990 over the prior year primarily due to the Town receiving \$83,346 in engineering fees related to development and the EMS transport fees received from the in-house ambulance services now provided by the Town, which only began in April 2015. Transfers from other funds were higher than last year by \$435,000, which are related to the funds set aside at the end of the

previous fiscal year in the Capital Projects Fund and timing differences on the quarterly franchise fee paid to the General Fund from the Water & Sewer Fund.

The top revenue categories that is lower than last year is Miscellaneous, with a total of \$176,113 which is \$381,784 lower than last year due the Town receiving \$380,000 debt proceeds in the previous fiscal year to purchase EMS vehicles and equipment. Franchise fees are down by \$209,967 due to timing of payments being received.

General Fund expenditures total \$7,207,419 and represent 96.3 percent of the total annual budget. Expenditures are \$10,544 more than the previous year and expenditures for all divisions are within the acceptable range. The decrease of expenditures in the Planning & Zoning and Fire Departments can be attributed to a decrease in contractual services being provided and not purchasing the in-house EMS capital as in the prior year, respectively. Inspection Department expenditures are higher by \$103,908 from prior year due to contracted plan review/inspections for new commercial buildings being built. The increase of expenditures in Non-Departmental is due to the 380 Agreement payment to Villages of Fairview. The Town transferred \$160,490 to the Technology Fund, which is \$58,044 higher than the previous fiscal year due to added budgeted technology expenditures this fiscal year.

## Water & Wastewater Fund Analysis



The Water & Sewer Fund revenues total \$5,100,297 and represent 96.6 percent of the total annual budget. This amount is \$22,487 higher than last year. Water sales were lower by \$480,778 than the previous year due to residents conserving usage and increased rainfall, while Miscellaneous revenue was

higher by \$23,534 than previous year due a higher refund from North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) on over-payment for billed water. Due to timing of the transfer from the Debt Service Fund, an increase of \$493,263 occurs in the transfer category when compared to the prior fiscal year.

Expenses for the Water and Sewer Fund total \$5,566,183 and represent 87.5 percent of the annual budget. This amount is \$1,032,154 higher than last year of which \$891,967 is related to debt principal payments that will be adjusted for audit purposes. An increase of \$197,514 or 9.3 percent occurred due to the increase in water purchase rates and sewer treatment rates established by the NTMWD.

## Other Funds Analysis

The increased expenditures in the Fairview EDC and CDC funds of \$94,176 and \$162,333 respectively are primarily due to the 380 Agreement with The Village at Fairview. The revenues and expenditures for all the other operating funds are within an acceptable percentage range. Revenues and expenditures will be monitored and reported to ensure that spending will not exceed the approved budget amounts.

## Sales Tax Analysis

Sales tax revenue collections for the entire Town of Fairview (Town, Fairview EDC and Fairview CDC portions) for twelfth month of fiscal year 2016 total \$3,208,904. Actual total collection this year is \$190,229 higher than last year or 6.3 percent.

The Town of Fairview received \$232,253.49 in sales tax revenue during the month of September 2016. This amount represents an increase of \$13,417 or 6.2 percent more than September 2015.

Due to the timing of this report, the sales tax received in the month of October 2016 can be reported in this financial report too. The Town of Fairview received \$230,045 during the month of October 2016. This amount represents an increase of \$3,001 or 1.4 percent more than October 2015.
