

- Maybe for the first time ever, our fire and police forces are fully staffed. This is a credit to the focus on this objective by our new Police Chief Chris Chandler and our Fire Chief Jeff Bell. Way to go guys!
- Under the leadership of John Adler, our Technology Advisory Committee will start including a quarterly topic in our Town newsletter.
- After months of effort and review by our entire Town staff and the Council, the Council approved an ordinance at our last meeting that updates our Subdivision regulations. These regulations are important as they specify the standards for drawing and recording a plat and the requirements for public infrastructure construction to make a property suitable for development.

If you remember during the COVID outbreak, the Town had set up a streaming arrangement that enabled residents to remotely listen in on Council meetings. With milder weather ahead, more people consider holding garage or yard sales. Permits are not required for residents to hold a garage/yard sale in Fairview, but please adhere to signage restrictions.

One sign is permitted at the site of the yard/garage sale, and a total of two directional signs are permitted at road intersections. Signs may be in place up to one day before the sale and must be removed immediately after the sale has ended.

Signs for garage and yard sales are limited to size – no larger than 60 square inches. Please consult Fairview Ordinance 3.13.012(e) for specific details of sign restrictions. The entire Code of Ordinances is available at FairviewTexas.org under the "Government" tab.

Celtic Folk Music

Patrick O-Shaun Young will guide the audience through a special presentation of KelticDead Music at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, March 7. Selections of KelticDead stories and



tunes will demonstrate
how Celtic folk
music resonates in the
American experience.
Those who wish, come
prepared to sing along
in this special KDM
Broadside presentation.
Young is a video-

based storyteller, author, songwriter, and the creator of the web-based, audio-visual KelticDead Music Video Broadsides. Here, stories are found within the music of Celtic, folk, old timey and seafaring tunes that continue to impact the modern world.

Young is a retired audio-visual systems engineer who uses his studio skills to create music-story presentations in the tradition of the 16th Century Broadside formats. These are freely accessible from his KelticDead Music website.

Young is recognized in the 2023-24 Marquis Who's Who Publications Board for his work with the KelticDead Music initiative.

Fiddlinda & Friends: An Evening of Celtic Music

Celebrating the enchanting music of the Celtic tradition, Fiddlinda & Friends will perform at 7:30 p.m. Friday, March 15. With a repertoire including ancient laments, contemporary ballads, traditional Irish tunes, Scottish Gaelic folksongs and a few footstomping jigs and reels, this group promises a full evening of lively entertainment.

Playing fiddle since the age 10, Linda Relph became part of the Texas Irish music scene after relocating from California in



the early 90s. Besides traditional Irish, her background includes contest fiddling (she was the California State Ladies Champion four times), Celtic Rock (founding member of The Killdares), greengrass (bluegrasstinged Irish, courtesy of her former band Nine-8ths Irish) and even country (playing with several George Strait Tribute bands). She likes to call herself a "mercenary fiddler," as she'll play with just about anyone, anywhere.

Toar Schell has been a mainstay of the traditional Irish music community for over 25 years. He describes himself as a semicompetent banjo player and plays mandolin, fiddle and banjo.

Candy Schell plays fiddle, mandolin, bodhran and button accordion. She is a regular at local music sessions and is almost always at J. Gilligan's sessions on Tuesday nights in Arlington. She is also a member of the TIMES Band & Session Players.

Matt Cook started his Irish traditional music journey many years ago around campfires, singing the songs of days long past. As the years have gone by, more instruments have been added, and even more songs and tunes have snuck into his repertoire.

Myles and LaSonjia Jack: Allen American Hockey

Myles Jack and his mother LaSonjia Jack, the first African-American majority owners in professional hockey history, will share their story at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, March 21.

Prior to retiring last month, Myles spent seven seasons in the NFL. The majority of his career was with the Jacksonville Jaguars, who drafted him in 2016 as the 36th overall pick. He also played for the Pittsburgh Steelers and the Philadelphia Eagles.

Jack was nominated for both the NFL's 2021 Salute to Service Award and the Walter Payton Man of the Year award, the league's highest off-field honor.

Alongside Myles, president/COO/coowner of Amsonia Sports, LaSonjia is also fully focused on the success of the Allen Americans. She is dedicated to bringing a competitive spirit to the Americans, as well as a positive impact to the community off the ice.

"It's such an honor to lead such a great hockey team in Texas, which is a great place for families and businesses," she said. "We are looking forward to engaging all our fans, business partners, and community leaders. The Allen Americans are a pillar in this community, and we will continue that tradition."

The Fairview Police Department is participating in the Drug Enforcement Agency's Drug Take Back Day to collect and dispose of unneeded medications to prevent medication misuse and opioid addiction.

Bring unneeded medications to Fire Station 1, 510 S. State Highway 5, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, April 27.

Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain in the original container and tightly sealed to prevent leakage. Medication in tablet or capsule form may be poured directly into the disposal box or disposed of in its original container.

Inhalers and injectables, including intravenous solutions and pre-loaded syringes, will not be accepted because of potential hazards.



ARE YOU SAFE ON SOCIAL MEDIA?

Everyone should educate themselves on the benefits and risks associated with social media. Connecting and engaging safely on social media requires vigilance. The following are best practices recommended by the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency and other cybersecurity experts:

Think before you post: Ask the questions, "Am I comfortable sharing such information? Does this posting create risk now or down the road?" No matter how quickly you delete a post or picture, it's likely someone saw it. Everyone should understand the importance of owning their digital lives so they can avoid putting themselves or others in a bad situation.

Turn off location/geotagging features: Many social media platforms allow users to keep their location hidden. It may be fun to "check-in" and show where you're visiting, but you're telling people where to find you and that you aren't home. Always know if you're sharing location information and with whom you're sharing it.

Connect with people you trust: Some social media platforms may seem safer because of limited personal information shared. However, you should keep your connections limited to people you know and trust. Many platforms have privacy settings that allow users to limit what content others can see.

Verify before you click: Don't click on suspicious links or files or respond to messages asking for money or personal information. Even if the message looks like it's from a friend or family member, their account may have been hacked. Call them to check. Before buying something, research the company. Search their name online along with words like "scam" or "complaint."

Speak up if you're uncomfortable: If a friend posts something about you that makes you uncomfortable or you think is inappropriate, let them know. Likewise, you should stay open-minded if a friend approaches you about something you posted. Children should report any instances of cyberbullying.

Enable multi-factor authentication (MFA) and check your account settings: MFA requires anyone logging into an account to prove their identity multiple ways (e.g. username, password, one-time verification code). Check your account settings on each social media platform to determine what access permissions you want to allow or restrict.

She is currently in rehearsals for Miss Nelson is Missing, which will be her seventh production at NTPA.




The ABCs of Weekly Trash and Recycling Collection

Remember these tips to ensure efficient trash and recycling pickup:


- **a. Arrange** carts carefully with handles facing your home, lids open toward the street, and 2 feet of space between carts and other objects.
- **b. Be** punctual by placing carts at the edge of the street no earlier than 5 p.m. the day before collection and no later than 7 a.m. on collection day. Roll carts back to your house by 6 a.m. the day after pickup.
- **c.** <u>Close</u> lids without clamping or locking. If your trash cart is full, purchase a pink tag for \$2.14 from the Town. Only bags with Town-issued tags will be collected outside carts (except during bulk pickup week).

Did You Know? Empty cardboard boxes don't have to go to the landfill. If they're clean and dry, they can be cut down and folded flat to fit inside your recycling cart.

Solid Waste Collection Tips

Trash and Recycling

- Trash should be contained inside securely tied plastic bags, and all bags should fit inside your solid blue cart with the lid closed.
- **Pink tags** may be purchased from the town for \$2.14 each and placed on every excess bag that doesn't fit inside your trash cart. Other than during bulk collection weeks, bags sitting outside of carts without a town-issued tag won't be collected.
- **Recyclables** should be placed loose, without bagging, into recycling carts, which are either solid green or dark blue with a lighter blue lid.
- Lids on trash and recycling carts may not be clamped or locked.

- Place carts with handles facing the house and lids opening toward the street or alley.
- Place carts 2 to 3 feet apart and away from each other or any objects that may obstruct the pickup arm.
- Carts should be placed at the curb by 7 a.m. on collection day and no earlier than 5 p.m. the prior day. Carts must be rolled away from the street after trash
- is collected no later than 6 a.m. the following day.
- Hazardous waste cannot be picked up by Republic Services.

Bulk and Brush

· Brush and bulk waste may be

- collected on any day during your brush and bulk pickup week.
- Bulk and brush should be cut into 4-foot lengths and neatly stacked.
- Up to 12 cubic yards of brush and bulk are allowed per address in a month.
- A single cubic yard is 3 feet long, 3 feet wide and 3 feet tall.
- Call Republic Services at 972-422-2341 to schedule an unusually large pickup and get a cost quote for the special pickup.
