



The current phase of the Stacy Road improvements on the north side is near completion. In mid to late June, the traffic switchover to the north side of the road will occur. Traffic will become two-way on the new northern concrete lanes for the time being.

The next phase will be excavation of the middle and south side of the road as well as the preparation for the two lanes on the south side. This phase will occur over several months, much like the northern half. Road message boards will be posted to notify drivers of the upcoming switch. As always, drive slowly and obey all construction warning and speed signs.

The Fairview Public Art Committee hosted the Town of Fairview Art Show to great success from April 21 to 23, 2017. The second Town show drew more than 150 pieces of original artwork and photography from more than 70 different entrants from Pre-K to Adult.

All award winners except for the People's Choice Award and the Town Choice Awards, were selected by featured juror, Fort Worth artist, Gary Joe Uribe. Uribe earned a Master of Fine Art Degree from the University of Texas at Arlington and a Bachelor of Fine Art with specialization in Printmaking, Drawing and Painting from the University of North Texas; his primary medium is drawing. Uribe is the recipient of numerous art awards including being a finalist for the prestigious Hunting Art Prize in Houston, Texas in 2016. Uribe has exhibited his art locally, domestically and internationally as well as being an adjunct professor at UTA.

Amongst the numerous pieces available to him, Uribe selected Lady of the Fall by Jin Lee as the Grand Prize Winner of \$500. Three's a Crowd by Sheila Lonian was in First Place for Visual Arts with a prize of \$250, Beginnings by former Lovejoy ISD student, Summer Peterson came in Second Place with a prize of \$150 and a 2016 Fairview Art Show prizewinner, Pamela Van Laanen, came in Third Place with Mission Accomplished for a prize of \$100.

New this year was the addition of separate photography divisions for adults and students alike. Three Fairview residents managed to garner award-winning selection by Uribe in the Adult Photography division with Stu Mair coming in First Place with Fish? for a prize of \$250; Charlie Henkle in Second Place for \$150 with Chilean Woman and Gretchen Day in Third Place for \$100 with Hillside Sunset.

The Fairview Public Art Committee additionally selected several Town Choice Award winners to split a cash prize of \$400 amongst the four works of art chosen. This year's Town Choice selections were Blind Contours by former Lovejoy student, Ben Wortham; both Phases and Koy by another 2016 Fairview Art Show prizewinner, Sam Lawrence; and Pot au Fleur by Julie Mah-Pon. All of the cash prize recipients are currently on display in Fairview Town Hall for a period of one year.

This year, the Committee created even more Student Divisions with Early Elementary, Intermediate, Middle, High and the Photography Divisions available to entrants. In the High Division, students in grades 9 through 12 competed and Anukriti Singh won a First Place medal with Gaze, Jack Condit was in Second Place with Baseball and Stephanos Deaton came in Third Place with *Deadly Temptation*.

In the Middle Division, students in grades 6 through 8 competed with Kaya Czyz in both First and Third Places with The Woman and Combustibility, respectively. Second Place in the Middle Division went to Jenna Garcia with The Hummingbird.

The Intermediate Division, for students in grades 3 to 5, saw more than 30 entries with First Place going to Golden Forest by Zachary Zou, Second Place to Juby by Amy Wang, Third Place to Water Lilies by Yolanda Pan and Honorable Mentions to Girl and Geese by Tiffany Zhang as well as Galaxy by Bayleigh Martinez.

Students from Pre-K up to grade 2 competed in the Early Elementary Division with Lillian Verret earning a First Place medal for Dos and her sister Madeline Verret in Second Place with Quatro. Third Place went to The Eevee by Catherine Pruitt and Honorable Mentions were awarded to Luke Glotzbach for Black on Rainbow Tree as well as Ameya Indaram for Love.

Finally, the Student Photography Division allowed all students under the age of 18 to enter their favorite photos. Jack Czyz, sibling of Visual Arts Middle Division winner, Kaya Czyz, coincidentally also won both First and Third Place medals for Cat Combo and Untitled, respectively. In Second Place was Stephanos Deaton winning again with Tree of Avalon.

The three-day event in the Fairview Town Center shopping center saw several hundred visitors culminating on Sunday afternoon with the show's awards reception, featuring music from acoustic guitarist and Fairview resident, Shane Frame. Frame has established The Guitar Sanctuary and Performance Academy in McKinney, which he calls, "the world's coolest boutique guitar shop and music school." At the reception, Mayor Culbertson gave certificates to every child who entered as well as handing out medals and posing for photos with the Art Show winners.

The Fairview Public Art Committee and Town Staff would like to thank all who entered, attended and volunteered for the event. Boards and Commissions

Interested in getting involved in serving your community? Every year, dozens of Town residents volunteer their time and talents by serving on a Town Board, Commission or Committee. The Town utilizes these citizen run Boards and Commissions to ensure public input and participation in the setting of policy and in the Town's decision-making processes.

Find the Application to Serve at fariviewtexas.org by selecting "Boards and Commissions" from the "Government" dropdown. The Town Council reviews all applications and votes on all board appointments and reappointments. Boards and Commission renewals and replacements occur every summer, so residents are encouraged to apply to be members of any of our many boards and commissions. To be eligible, individuals must be a registered voter in the Town, may not be in arrears on property taxes and must complete an Application to Serve. Completed Applications to Serve should be emailed to Town Secretary, Liz Cappon at ECappon@ fairviewtexas.org.

Planning and Zoning Commission

The Planning and Zoning Commission is comprised of seven Commissioners. It is the Planning and Zoning Commission's duty to make and recommend a master plan, as a whole or in parts, for the future development and redevelopment of the town. The Commission hears, recommends and determines matters related to zoning, platting and subdivision control as specified

or required by town ordinance, charter and state law. The Commission meets monthly in the Town Hall Council Chambers on the second Thursday of the month.

Economic Development (EDC) and Community Development Corporation (CDC) Board of Directors

The EDC and CDC Board of Directors are comprised of seven board members, with each member serving on both the EDC and CDC board. The EDC Board of Directors is responsible for promoting the economic growth and diversification in the Town of Fairview as well as for overseeing the half-penny sales tax collected for this purpose. The CDC Board of Directors is responsible for promoting the community through infrastructure construction projects funded through the half-penny sales tax collected for this purpose. The EDC/ CDC Board typically meets monthly in the Town Hall Council Chambers on the third Wednesday of the month.

Zoning Board of Adjustment

The Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA) is comprised of Board Members and Alternates. The ZBA makes decisions on appeals and requests for variances to the Town's ordinances. This Board meets as needed.

Technology Advisory Committee

The Technology Advisory Committee is comprised of seven committee members. The Technology Committee investigates opportunities to provide more efficient and

effective technology outlets for the Town and its residents. This Committee typically meets on the second Monday of the month in the Fire Station #2 Community Room.

Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board is comprised of seven board members. This Board acts in an advisory capacity in all matters pertaining to Parks and Recreation, including present and future maintenance, operation, planning, acquisition, development, enlargement as well as use policies of the Town Parks and Recreation services. This Board meets as needed.

Environmental Management Advisory Committee

The Environmental Management Advisory Committee is comprised of seven Committee Members. The Environmental Management Advisory Committee investigates opportunities to promote responsible environmental plans, projects, regulations, guidelines as well as other activities that serve to promote and protect the natural environment of the community. This Committee typically meets on the third Monday of the month in the Fire Station #2 Community Room.

Public Art Committee

The Public Art Committee is comprised of five Committee Members. The Public Art Committee is responsible for administering the Town's public art program and organizing the Town of Fairview Art Show. This Committee meets as needed.

Bulk items may be placed outside no earlier than 5 p.m. the Friday before your designated Monday and must be out by 7 a.m. on Monday. Republic Services will pick up bulk items between Monday and Friday on your designated week. See the color coded chart for more details. If your regular trash/recycle pick-up day or bulk Monday falls on a holiday, service will resume the following business day. Bulk/brush is limited to 12 cubic yards or four truck loads.
