Hi Fairview!

Welcome to summer! We have had a wet spring ... but for the next 3-4 months, rain is a rare occurrence. So this month, I wanted to address our water system.

Fairview receives all of its water from the North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD), which is a state-sponsored nonprofit corporation charged with providing water, sewer, and landfill services for 10 north Texas counties. Related to their water services, NTMWD builds and maintains reservoir, water treatment plants, pump stations, and an extensive water distribution network. NTMWD plans for growth at least for 20 years in the future.

NTMWD delivers treated water to two sites in Fairview. Fairview then stores and distributes that water to our residents. The Fairview water distribution system was expanded and upgraded in 2020 with the addition of the Country Club road storage and pump station. We now have the capacity built into the system where we will not need capacity additions for a long time.

Water (and sewer) rates for Fairview residents are set every year as the Council works to set the next year's budget and tax rate. Rates are set based on the following criteria:

- What NTWMD charges the Town of Fairview for water. Years ago, the Town would subsidize water rates with property tax revenues. The Council has decided that each city service should be self-supporting ... so price increases from NTMWD are usually passed through to our residents. In the past decade, the price charged by NTMWD has nearly doubled.
- Cost of operating the Fairview distribution network.
- Making payments on existing debt.
- Maintaining reserve requirements.

With all that being said, I hope you all stay well hydrated while also focusing on conservation. Saving water keeps your costs down and protects water reserves.

Have a safe summer, and remember that kiddos head back to school in August. Watch for school zones, buses, pedestrians and kids on bikes!

Operational Procedures for Aug. 6 Council Meeting

The Town anticipates significant interest in the Aug. 6, 2024, Town Council meeting and has scheduled the meeting to be held at 351 Southwind Lane, known as Accacia's Event Venue.

The building has a seating capacity of 494 for the meeting. Other than Town staff, no more than 494 people will be permitted into the building for the meeting at any one time.

Reserved Seating System

The Town is ensuring equal access and is streamlining entry to the meeting by establishing a seating reservation system for a portion of the available seating. This seating will be located in the main ballroom where the Council will be seated. The reservation system will become available to the public at 10 a.m. (Central Daylight Time) on July 29. A link to the seating reservation site will be available on FairviewTexas.org beginning July 29.

Residents and nonresidents may reserve one seat at a time, and reserved seating will be allocated equally and limited to approximately 140 residents and 140 nonresidents. When all reserved seats are claimed for the individual groups, the reservation system will display a "sold out" message for that group.

Staff cannot guarantee that families or affiliated groups will be able to sit together. Reserved seating guarantees a seat in the main ballroom but not a specific seat or location in the ballroom.

In order to reserve a seat, you must provide your name and a valid address for your residence, and you must certify that you are either a resident or nonresident. Reservations made with an address that doesn't match the corresponding category are subject to cancellation. Tickets for reserved seats will be scanned upon entry into the facility, which will open to the public beginning at 6 p.m. Aug. 6. Reserved seat holders must be seated by 7:15 p.m., or their seats will be released for non-reserved seating. Anyone who does not bring a printed or an electronic copy of their reserved seating confirmation will not be allowed into the reserved seating area and will need to move to the line of people waiting for non-reserved seating.

Non-Reserved Seating

In addition to the reserved seating outlined above, approximately 214 seats will be available on a first-come, first-served basis in auxiliary rooms in the building. These rooms will have audio and video access to the meeting. Those seats will be filled by those waiting in line on a first-come, first-served basis beginning at 6:30 p.m.

General Procedures

Admission to the facility will only be permitted as long as available seating remains, and seating is not guaranteed to anyone. Persons with disabilities may request accommodations such as wheelchair access if a request is made at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting to the Town Secretary.

No standing room or floor seating will be available inside the facility, and no outside chairs or other supplies, including canopies, umbrellas or ice chests, may be brought into the building.

Anyone wishing to address the Council during the meeting must be present inside the building and must follow posted procedures.

As people in any of the rooms exit the building, those seats will become available on a first-come, first-served basis to people waiting outside the building.

For safety, sections of some roads or some parking may be closed to traffic on Aug. 6. Please refer to FairviewTexas.org prior to arrival for information about road closures and detours. Please plan ahead for traffic delays. Seating reservations will not be held after 7:15 p.m. Aug. 6.

Live streaming of the meeting will be permitted outside of the facility, and access to the live stream has been increased for this meeting. Wireless Internet access will not be available at the site.

Please observe all signs and directions from staff, and do not block any designated parking spaces or traffic. No overnight camping will be permitted. Restrooms inside Accasia's Event Venue will not be available to anyone outside the building.

Some details of these procedures may be amended prior to the start of the meeting. Please check FairviewTexas.org for updates. The Town cannot guarantee that all technology will perform as planned, as unforeseen conditions may impact that performance.

The Town anticipates a high volume of inquiries, and assistance will not be available by phone. Email responses will be provided promptly and in the order in which emails are received.


Construction of Fairview Crossing (replacement of Frisco Road) is nearing completion, including connections and tie-ins to Spur 399. Connections to Medical Center Drive and FM 1378 are under construction, and a left turn lane from northbound State Highway 5 to Fairview Crossing will be added soon. An opening date for the road will be announced after final road improvements to SH 5 and the new traffic signals are operational.

In July, crews for the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) were nearing completion of the Ridgeview Overpass. The old frontage lanes were being replaced with newly aligned lanes from the overpass to the Allen Outlet Mall, as well as improvements to the center driving lanes on U.S. 75.

TxDOT crews have installed protected left turn (green arrow) lights on FM 1378 (Country Club) at Stacy Road.

A contract for construction of the northern extension of Fairview Parkway is scheduled to be awarded in August.




A Drive to Succeed

The belted kingfisher is one of the larger species of these water birds. They have gorgeous blue-grey coloring on their heads and wings, and they have a white breast area. The female of the species will also showcase a chestnut-colored belly band.

They can sometimes be

spotted perched alone along riverbanks, streams and lakes.

More often though, you won't see them. Their loud warning chatter is what you will hear as they fly away, once they detect your presence, and you'll be left thinking, "Darn! I just missed spotting that elusive belted kingfisher again."

They live mostly on a diet of fish, crawdads, various insects, reptiles, and occasionally wild berries they may encounter while out foraging. Heard Wildlife Sanctuary is one of the best areas here in the Fairview/McKinney area to try your luck at spotting one. Happy birding!


The ABCs of Weekly Trash and Recycling Collection

Remember these tips to ensure efficient trash and recycling pickup:


- **a. Arrange** carts carefully with handles facing your home, lids open toward the street, and 2 feet of space between carts and other objects.
- **b. Be** punctual by placing carts at the edge of the street no earlier than 5 p.m. the day before collection and no later than 7 a.m. on collection day. Roll carts back to your house by 6 a.m. the day after pickup.
- **c.** <u>Close</u> lids without clamping or locking. If your trash cart is full, purchase a pink tag for \$2.14 from the Town. Only bags with Town-issued tags will be collected outside carts (except during bulk pickup week).

Did You Know? Empty cardboard boxes don't have to go to the landfill. If they're clean and dry, they can be cut down and folded flat to fit inside your recycling cart.

Avoid Missed Trash Collections

Republic Services has added more drivers, which allows collection of trash and recycling to occur more efficiently. Because of the change, collection trucks may reach your street earlier than in the past.

Please ensure all trash and recycling carts are at the curb no later than 7 a.m. on scheduled collection days to avoid a missed collection.

Other things to keep in mind:

All trash going to the landfill should be contained inside securely tied plastic bags, and all bags should fit inside your

- solid blue cart with the lid closed.
- Pink tags may be purchased from the Town for \$2.14 each and placed on excess bags that don't fit inside your trash cart. Other than during bulk collection weeks, bags sitting outside of carts without a Townissued tag won't be collected.
- Recyclables should be placed loose, without bagging, into recycling carts, which are either solid green or dark blue with a lighter blue lid.
- Clean and dry empty cardboard boxes may be cut down and

- folded flat to fit inside recycling bins.
- Never clamp or lock lids on trash or recycling carts.
- Place carts with handles facing the house and lids opening toward the street or alley.
- Carts must be placed 2 to 3 feet apart and away from objects that may obstruct the pickup arm.


