Stacy Road Update

The concrete paving for the southern two lanes on the Allen-side of Stacy Road is underway, commencing from State Highway 5 and working its way to FM-1378. The Stacy Road intersections at Angel Parkway as well as at FM-1378 will also be completed with this paving. The northbound approach to FM-1378 and Stacy Rd is getting a separate left turn lane as well as a through lane. Please watch the construction flagmen as the concrete trucks will be unloading and heading back to U.S. 75.

The area is getting much closer to the ultimate goal of this project for a four-lane divided road and the much needed capacity improvements. For those using Old Stacy Road as a cut-through between FM-1378 and Stacy Road, please be aware that the speed limit on Old Stacy is 25 mph. Also, be sure to pay attention to the stop signs along the mid-section of Old Stacy. As always, thank you for your patience and drive safely.

Happy New Year!! I hope that you had a great Christmas with family and friends and that you are planning for an exciting and fun New Year!

As this is the first Mayor's Note that I have written since the results of the Bond Election, a few observations are important. First, I want to acknowledge the voter turnout.... It was OUTSTANDING to have roughly 25 percent of registered voters in Town participate in the process. It was also clear that the path put forward by the Town Council was not the path that our residents desire. The Council owns the previous path and the results of that path.

The morning after the election, I met with our Public Works team and separately met with our Fire Department. While they had lots of questions and some concerns, my message to them and my message to you is that the Council will get back to work and develop a better path. What that path

will be, what that path will cost, when might that path will come to fruition are all good and fair questions that will be properly deliberated, debated and ultimately decided. One of our goals during our next round of deliberation is to be more determined about soliciting and synthesizing your feedback and I have spoken to the Council regarding some options. Bottom line, this matter is too important to be further kicked down the road and I will not do that. And so, we get back to work, by taking input from our residents to develop a new path.

I wish you and your family a very Happy New Year! In quoting Benjamin Franklin, "Be at War with your Vices, at Peace with your Neighbors and let every New Year find you a better man."

At the October 10 and 18, special Town Council Town Hall meetings, the Town Council addressed the following item:

- The Council gave a presentation and participated in a discussion with citizen input regarding the 2017 Bond Package for a new municipal complex and related matters.

At the Wednesday, November 8, 2017, regular Town Council meeting, the Town Council addressed the following items:

- Received a report regarding the opening of the new Residence Inn by Marriott from Bennett Pappas, Director of Sales.
- Mayor Darion Culbertson presented a proclamation declaring the week of November 11 through 19, 2017 as Homelessness Awareness Week in the Town of Fairview.
- Mayor Darion Culbertson presented an Arbor Day Proclamation, including a presentation by staff to observe Fairview's commitment to preserving its trees and natural beauty.
- Approved the minutes of the August 14, 2017, special Council meeting.
- Approved the minutes of the August 21, 2017, special Council meeting.
- Approved the minutes of the September 19, 2017, special Council meeting.
- Approved the 2017 Tax Roll as submitted by the Collin County Appraisal District.
- Approved a resolution authorizing the Chief of Police to apply for and accept a grant for rifle-resistant body armor.
- Authorized the Town Manager to enter into an agreement for town depository services.
- Authorized the Town Manager to execute an agreement with Oncor for relocation of utilities on East Stacy Road.
- Approved a development plan for an entryway monument for the Oak Meadows Addition. The site is located near the terminus of Red Oak Trail and is zoned for the (PC) Planned Center District. Applicant: Stephen Dinapoli.
- Approved a Final Plat for the Apple Crossing Addition. The 38.5-acre site is located at the southeast corner of Highway 5 and Country Club Road and is zoned for the (CPDD) Commercial Planned Development District with the Urban Transition sub-district. Applicant: Casey Ross, Kimley-Horn and Associates.
- Conducted a public hearing and approved a conditional use permit (CUP) for a sports court (tennis court). The 1.0-acre site is located at 781 Stallion Drive and is zoned for the (RE-1) One-Acre Ranch Estate District. Applicant: Shamin Choudhury representing Susan and Abdalla Hussain. (CUP 2017-02).
- Conducted a public hearing and approved by a vote of 5 to 2, a major warrant to allow off-premise advertising on a digital monument sign. The site is located on the east side of US 75 and north of Murry Farm Road and is zoned for the (CPDD) Commercial Planned Development District with the Urban Village Sub-district. Applicant: Matt Gallo, Lincoln Property Management. (MW2017-01).
- Discussed the design of Fairview Parkway and related matters.
- Discussed road maintenance on Lakewood, Timber and Old Stacy.
- Discussed the outcome of the 2017 bond election and next steps as well as a possible date for the election canvass.
- Made reappointments to several Boards and Commissions.
- Received the Monthly Financial Report for the period ending September 30, 2017.
- Received the Quarterly Investment Report for the period ending September 30, 2017.
- Received a Stacy Road update.

2018 Trash Schedule Changes



Due to the increasing volume of trash and recycling being picked up within the Town, Republic Services will be adding a third pick up day to the Town's trash and recycling schedule in 2018.

Residents will continue to receive weekly trash and recycling services and one-time monthly brush/bulk collection services, limited to 12 cubic yards. However, beginning in 2018, the western portion of Town, including the Commercial Planned Development District (CPDD) pickup will occur on Mondays. Heritage Ranch pickups will continue to be on Tuesdays. And, the remainder of the eastern portion of Town will be picked up on Wednesdays.

Town Election Application Deadlines

The Town of Fairview operates under a Council-Manager form of government. The Town Council consists of a Mayor and six Councilmembers that are volunteers elected at-large.

According to the Town of Fairview Charter, no person shall serve as Mayor for more than three successive terms, and no person shall serve as Councilmember for more than three successive terms. Their term of office shall be for a period of two years or any portion thereof.

The Town's next General Election will occur on Saturday, May 5, 2018. The terms of office that will expire in May 2018 are Town Council Seats 2, 4 and 6. Town Council Mayor as well as Town Council Seats 1, 3 and 5 will expire in May 2019.

Potential candidate information packets will be available for pickup at Town Hall in the beginning of 2018; Town Hall is open Monday through

Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Candidates may begin returning their applications to be placed on the ballot and other candidate paperwork to Town Hall beginning on **Wednesday, January 17, 2018**. The deadline for filing applications to be placed on the ballot is **Friday, February 16, 2018**.

A Fairview Town Council candidate must:

- Be a qualified voter of the town
- Be twenty-one (21) years of age
- Have resided in the town no less than twelve months immediately preceding Election Day
- Meet the requirements of the Texas Election Code
- Continually reside within the town during the term of office

Tips for Seasonal Allergy Relief



As temperatures fall through the season, so do leaves and thus other allergens such as ragweed and mold begin to rise, resulting in watery and swollen eyes, sniffing and sneezing.

An overactive immune system that develops a hypersensitivity to normally harmless pollens, such as ragweed, is the cause of allergies. Symptoms are more likely when ragweed pollinates the air, causing a person's immune system to react. Common symptoms include itchy eyes and a runny nose, but allergies can also cause an itchy throat, itching inside the nose, swollen eyelids or stuffy nose and in some people, it can even cause fatigue or irritability.

"Treatment for mild pollen allergy is simple," said Matt Morgan, MD, an allergist on staff at Medical City McKinney. "Most over-the-counter medications and prescriptions are likely to work well."

However, people with severe ragweed allergies may experience recurring sinus infections, severe eye symptoms or it may even trigger serious asthma symptoms such as coughing, wheezing and tightness in the chest.

"When you experience severe symptoms that consistently result in sinus infections every season, then over-the-counter med-

ications might not be effective," said Dr. Morgan. "In the most severe cases, desensitization, such as allergy shots, might be the only available effective therapy."

Pollen extract in allergy shots is specifically designed to treat the immune response to ragweed or other weed pollens. This approach may require regular trips to the doctor. There are many effective over-the-counter solutions for allergy sufferers including Claritin, Zyrtec, Allegra and Xyzal.

"Antihistamines are the most basic allergy medicine," said Dr. Morgan. "Other options include steroid nasal spray such as Flonase and Nasacort, which benefit multiple symptoms including congestion, which is not treated with the oral antihistamines."

The residential renewal fee is \$25 and the commercial renewal fee is \$50.

The fee for a new residential permit is \$50 and a new commercial permit is \$100. If you have an alarm system and do not currently have an Alarm Permit, please contact Officer Gandy at SGandy@FairviewTexas.org or 972-886-4211, ext. 5022.

For those who currently have an alarm permit, online renewal begins January 1. Alarm permits must be renewed by January 31. To renew your permit, simply visit FairviewTexasAlarm.com. 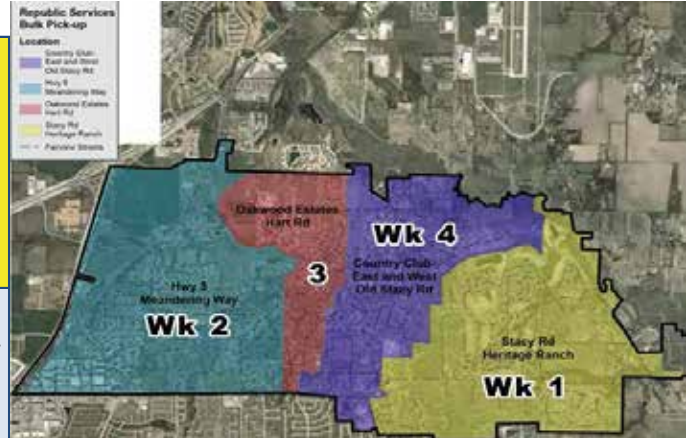
