

Stacy Road Update

Concrete paving is scheduled for installation on the southern 2 lanes as long as the temperatures are well above the freezing point, even at night. Temperature variations will be the controlling factor on how often concrete paving can be installed. The work will begin at SH5 and will move east toward FM1378. No additional closures are anticipated on the Fairview side during this installation.

The month of February is a great time to visit the Heard Museum because there is a lot to do. But first; if you haven't already; be sure to catch the Dinosaurs Live! exhibit before it closes on Sunday, February 18.

Contest categories will provide opportunities for participants of any age and skill level to submit their work. All photos are submitted electronically beginning February 3. The submission deadline is February 25. Winners will be notified by mail in March in time for the award ceremony on March 18. The Second Saturday Bird Walk will continue on February 10. The guided walks will teach participants how to spot and identify birds. Have you ever wondered what it would feel like to soar through the treetops? On February 17 (or March 10) at 1 p.m. you can experience the excitement of traveling the ropes course zip line! You'll climb a 23 foot tree to the zip line platform and get strapped in for the ride of your life down the 487 foot line. Each ride on the zip line is \$12. Pre-registration is required and can be done online at http://www.heardmuseum.org/ropescourse#zip. Be sure to register soon before all the spaces are gone.

The Heard Museum is a great place for scouts to experience a fun nature-based activity or to even earn badges. The Heard offers two hour workshops that can be specifically geared to the meet the requirements for certain badges.

Badge opportunities for Brownies will be on February 3 and will include Wonders of Water at 10 a.m. and Senses at 2 p.m. Webelos will also have opportunities on February 10 with Earth Rocks at 10 a.m. and Into the Wild at 2 p.m. There will also be an Into the Woods badge workshop for Webelos on February 17 at 2 p.m. Badge workshops are \$15 per scout and \$12 per adult. For every 10 paid scouts, one adult will receive free admission. This price includes museum admission for the day.

On February 17 at 10 a.m. scouts can experience the ecology, geology, flora and fauna of the Heard Sanctuary. Led by our trained guides, groups will spend 45-60 minutes hiking the unique landscape of the Heard. Guided trail tours for scouts are \$9 per child (age 3-12) and \$12 per adult chaperone, admission to museum included in this fee.

SUPER BOWL RECIPES

BLACK EYED PEA DIP

1- 2oz jar diced pimentos (drained)

Fairview Alarm Permit Renewals

The Town of Fairview requires all alarm systems in any home or business in Fairview, whether monitored or not, to have a valid Alarm Permit. Alarm Permits must be renewed annually during the month of January.



The residential renewal fee is \$25 and the commercial renewal fee is \$50.

The fee for a new residential permit is \$50 and a new commercial permit is \$100. If you have an alarm system and do not currently have an Alarm Permit, please contact Officer Gandy at SGandy@FairviewTexas.org or 972-886-4211, ext. 5022.

For those who currently have an alarm permit, online renewal begins January 1. Alarm permits must be renewed by January 31. To renew your permit, simply visit FairviewTexasAlarm. com. On the site, you will need to enter your login name and password. If you are having trouble remembering your login name and/or password, please contact Officer Gandy, do not create a new account if you are having issues accessing your old account. Town Election Application Deadlines

The Town of Fairview operates under a Council-Manager form of government. The Town Council consists of a Mayor and six Councilmembers that are volunteers elected at-large.

According to the Town of Fairview Charter, no person shall serve as Mayor for more than three successive terms, and no person shall serve as Councilmember for more than three successive terms. Their term of office shall be for a period of two years or any portion thereof.

The Town's next General Election will occur on Saturday, May 5, 2018. The terms of office that will expire in May 2018 are Town Council Seats 2, 4 and 6. Town Council Mayor as well as Town Council Seats 1, 3 and 5 will expire in May 2019.

Potential candidate information packets will be available for pickup at Town Hall in the beginning of 2018; Town Hall is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Candidates may begin returning their applications to be placed on the ballot and other candidate paperwork to Town Hall beginning on **Wednesday, January 17, 2018**. The deadline for filing applications to be placed on the ballot is **Friday, February 16, 2018**.

A Fairview Town Council candidate must:

- Be a qualified voter of the town
- Be twenty-one (21) years of age
- Have resided in the town no less than twelve months immediately preceding Election Day
- Meet the requirements of the Texas Election Code
- Continually reside within the town during the term of office



The North Texas Performing Arts (NTPA) family of theatres (Plano Children's Theatre, Fairview Youth Theatre, Frisco Youth Theatre and NTPA Dallas) are dedicated to developing the character of youth through quality performing arts education and family entertainment.

The idea for Plano Children's Theatre (PCT) began 27 years ago during Grace Presbyterian Church's production of The Wizard of Oz directed by Sara Akers. When the production was almost over the families asked Sara what they were going to do next because they had such a great time they couldn't imagine not doing another show.

So, Sara, along with three founding board members Rebecca Egelston Caso, Dick Anthony and Lanny Wren got busy developing plans for a permanent theatre home. Their mission was simple: to provide arts opportunities for youth, ages 4-18, which promote life-long learning, creativity, communication skills, teamwork, integrity and good citizenship. And, just a few months later in the Spring of 1992 they had 50 students enrolled in classes and by summer break they had 175 students.

Plano Children's Theatre moved into their home at 15th and Custer in 1994 and renovated their overcrowded space in 2007. But, even before then, parents saw a need for a youth theatre north of Plano; so in 2005 they began renting space for classes and productions in McKinney. However, they wanted a permanent space to call their own, and with the help of the Fairview Economic Development Corporation, Fairview



Youth Theatre (FVYT) was born. Since officially opening its doors in January 2017 FVYT has seen an enormous increase in the number of students enrolled in their classes, camps and productions and a weekend rarely goes by without a major production being staged on either the mainstage or in the black box theatre and man times both spaces are filled.

2017 was a monumental year for NTPA – the Frisco Youth theatre found rehearsal space of their own, NTPA Dallas staged their first show and the NTPA headquarters & PCT moved to their new space at the Willow Bend Center for the Arts at Willow Bend Mall.

Since 1991, NTPA has welcomed more than 2,000,000 students, patrons, members and sponsors to their family of theatres and they aren't stopping anytime soon – just look what Fairview Youth Theatre has coming up in February.

On stage February 16 - 18 & 22 - 25 is Heathers, *The Musical (High School Edition)* the darkly delicious story of Veronica Sawyer, a brainy, beautiful teenage misfit who hustles her way into the most powerful and ruthless clique at Westerberg High: the Heathers. This show is recommended for audiences 13 years and up.

Little Women, the Musical will take the stage March 1 – 4. Produced nationally and internationally, Little Women has been praised by critics for its ambition in adapting such a well-known story for the stage. This timeless, captivating story is brought to life in this glorious musical filled with personal discovery, heartache, hope and everlasting love. The original production starred the unparalleled Sutton Foster, who received Tony, Outer Critics Circle and Drama Desk nominations for her performance.

Upcoming auditions include *Game of Tiaras* (grades 6-12) beginning February 8, *Rodgers & Hammerstein's Cinderella G2K* (grade K-5) beginning February 13 and the Spring Break Production of *Big Bad Wolf* will audition grades 3-6 on March 5.
