

Stacy Road Update

The concrete paving on the south side is nearing completion. Street and driveway connections as well as approaches are being finished. Work on the sidewalks and medians will begin shortly, followed by final grading and cleanup. Some additional capacity improvements have been approved at the intersection of State Highway 5 and Stacy Road with the addition of two northbound and southbound lanes across the intersection. This will involve some island and median adjustments, as well as traffic signal poles. As always, observe the recommended construction speed limits within the construction zones.

Mayor's Note

An Update on the Town Bond Process

In the last issue of Fairview Town News, I mentioned that the Council would be developing a new path to respond to our

residents as we move forward with planning for the capital needs of the Town. One of the primary Council goals in this process will be to ensure that we provide opportunity for residents from all areas of Town to both provide feedback as well as to participate in the planning for the next bond package. The needs of the Town have not gone away but clearly the methods that we use to address them, need to be re-thought.


The process includes first establishing a group of residents to assist in the process. This process is underway and should be complete by the end of January. Neighborhoods with an active HOA were asked to designate one or more representatives, based on the size of the neighborhood. Individual Councilmembers have also identified individuals from areas without active HOA's to serve on the group.

The goal is to have approximately 40-50 residents representing the Town who are willing to take the time to work on this as a group. We like to refer to this team as the Community Resource Group.

This group will meet first in February to provide feedback to the Council regarding the last bond election process. They will then be involved in assisting the Town in planning the projects to be considered in the next bond package. They will meet several times over the next 3-4 months and provide input to the Council regarding a revised plan. Once a draft plan has been developed and prior to calling a future bond election, the Town Council will hold one or more Town Hall meetings to invite feedback from all residents. The goal is to finalize a bond package that addresses the needs of the Town and the residents. The goal of the Council will be to have revised plan to bring back to the voters in November 2018.

To that end I will be periodically be providing our residents with information on the process as we go through it. I look forward to providing the next update and please feel free to reach out to me directly, if you have questions.

- Approved setting speed limits on U.S. 75


frontage road from Stacy to Ridgeview at 50 miles per hour.

HEARD HAPPENINGS



Now that the weather is getting warmer and sunnier spending time outside is on everyone's "To Do List." And, the Heard Museum is just the place to go. The month of March provides many opportunities to get out and enjoy nature including a spring break mini-camp.

The Second Saturday Bird Walk will continue on March 10. The guided walks will teach participants how to spot and identify birds. This is a great opportunity for new birders to get introduced to this interesting area of study.

When you're done with your bird walk on March 10 you can

experience what it's like to soar through the tree tops! At 1 p.m. the zip line will open for all who dare climb a 23 foot tall tree just to fly to the bottom of a 487 foot zip line. Each ride on the zip line is \$12. Pre-registration is required.

The evening of March 10 is the Owl Prowl Night Hike. This family friendly event will feature a live owl presentation and a guided night hike on the sanctuary trails. Night hikers will be encouraged to sharpen their senses to be able to spot signs of animal life and learn more about the inhabitants of the Heard. Preregistration is required and spots are limited.

The Heard also offers many opportunities for Scouts. For those interested in earning a scout badge or finding a fun nature-based activity for your group, a badge

workshop might be just what you need. Each two hour workshop is specifically geared to meet the requirements for the listed organization's badge, but they are open to any interested child. Be sure to visit heardmuseum. org/scouting for a list of all the upcoming workshops.

The Heard is the place to be during spring break (March 12-16)! Mini camps will be offered on Tuesday, March 13; Wednesday, March 14 and Thursday, March 15 from 9:30 a.m. to noon. Children in kindergarten through sixth grade are welcome. Each mini-camp explores a different topic and includes indoor activities and time outside exploring our 289 acre sanctuary. Pre-registration required and the cost is only \$20 per child per camp. Admission prices will also be reduced for children during Spring Break.







Town Quarterly Financial Report For Quarter Ending December 31, 2017





Monthly financial reports are prepared for the General Fund, Water and Wastewater Fund, Solid Waste Fund, Debt Service Fund, Stormwater Fund and Fairview EDC/CDC Funds, these reports are presented to the Town Council at their monthly meetings. These monthly financials can be accessed on fairviewtexas.org by selecting Departments/Administration/Audit-Budget.

This report covers through December 31, 2017, which is the end of the first quarter of fiscal year 2017-2018; therefore, it is generally desirable for year-to-date revenue totals to have achieved 25 percent of the budgeted amount and expenditures should generally not exceed 25 percent of the budgeted amounts. However, because property taxes are primarily received during the first trimester of the budget year and other revenues such as franchise fees are cyclical, revenues will not always equate to the projected percentage. Likewise, total expenditures may not always equate to the projected percentage, because payments for contracted services, insurance and debt service payments are paid in lump sum amounts, while transfers to other funds occur quarterly.

General Fund Analysis

Revenue collections in the General Fund for the third month of fiscal year 2018 total \$3,006,843 and represent 33.5 percent of the total annual budget. Actual total collection this year is \$403,511 higher than last year.

General Fund expenditures total \$1,956,900 and represent 21.8 percent of the total annual budget. Expenditures are \$86,555 more than the previous year. All other expenditures for all divisions are within the acceptable range.

During the Month of October and November, the majority of the revenues and expenditures received/expensed are related to the prior fiscal year; therefore, journal entries will be made to re-class revenue and expenditures actually received/spent in October and November 2017 to be recorded in September 2017 for audit purposes.

Water and Wastewater Fund Analysis

The Water and Sewer Fund revenues total \$1,347,378 and represent 22.0 percent of the total annual budget. This amount is \$343,633 higher than last year. Water sales were higher by \$296,187 and sewer sales were higher by \$34,829 than the previous year.

Expenses for the Water and Sewer Fund total \$1,031,248 and represent 14.5 percent of the annual budget. This amount is \$116,555 more than prior year.

During the Month of October and November 2017, the majority of the revenues and expenses received/ expensed are related to the prior fiscal year; therefore, journal entries will be made to re-class revenue and expenses

actually received/spent in October and November 2017 to be recorded in September 2017 for audit purposes.

Other Funds Analysis

The revenues and expenditures for all the other operating funds are within an acceptable percentage range. Revenues and expenditures will be monitored and reported to ensure that spending will not exceed the approved budget amounts.

Sales Tax Analysis

Sales tax revenue collections for the entire Town of Fairview (Town, Fairview EDC and Fairview CDC portions) for the third month of fiscal year 2018 total \$774,677. Actual total collection this year is \$6,772 or 0.9 percent higher than last year.

The Town of Fairview received \$193,586 in sales tax revenue during the month of December 2017. This amount represents a decrease of \$8,818 or 4.4 percent less than December 2016. Due to the timing, the sales tax received in the month of January 2018 can be reported in this financial report too. The Town of Fairview received \$219,699 during the month of January 2018. This amount represents a decrease of \$17,052 or 7.2 percent less than January 2017.

NEW NTTA Roadside Assistance

The NTTA has rolled out a new Roadside Safety Services (RSS) program. If you run out of gas, blow out a tire or need to be towed to the shoulder or off the roadway you can call #999.

New signs have been posted along all the NTTA roads informing drivers about the easy-to-remember number. When you dial #999 callers will be connected to the NTTA Safety Operations Center, a 24/7/365 emergency dispatch facility. When a call is received RSS crews and/or State Troopers will be on their way to help.

And, as we all know calls

should not be made while driving so NTTA is asking you to pull over before making the call and don't forget to turn on your hazard lights. If it's safe to do so, stay in your vehicle until help arrives. In an emergency, always call 9-1-1.

The #999 number is also a great tool for reporting stalled vehicles or debris in the road. And, when calling it's helpful to provide as much information as possible including location and description.


